### **OVERVIEW**

A total of 419 proposals were submitted under the call for standard projects. The proposals involve 2,959 organizations from the 13 countries participating in the Programme. The ENI CBC Med Programme composed of the representatives of 13 participating countries approved a list of 41 projects recommended for funding. Out of the 282 organizations involved, 61% are established in Mediterranean Partner Countries and 8 as lead beneficiary. Two projects as Lead Beneficiary from Tunisia were selected for this call including Co-Evolve4BGproject.

Co-Evolve4BG project aims at analyzing and promoting the co-evolution of human activities and natural systems in touristic coastal areas, allowing sustainable development goals within touristic activities based on the approach of Integrated Coastal Zone Management (ICZM)/Marine Spatial Planning (MSP) and thus fostering Blue Growth in the Mediterranean. This proposal is presented in the frame of the ENI CBC MED program's priority on environment-ICZM and constitutes a part of a wider project namely "Med Coast for Blue Growth" (MC4BG) - labelled by the 43 Countries of the UfM (S.O. meeting on 11/12/2017) in connection with the already running Co-Evolve project funded by Interreg MED program and in line with the strategic theme 2 of the Joint Action Plan (JAP) of the Bologna Charter Initiative, thus, producing an alignment of intervention, funding and synergies among the key players towards a major impact on the ground, and in particular on the Med partner countries concerned by the action (at cross boarder and transnational levels). The project focuses on the conditions for the co-evolution, as already addressed by the Interreg MED Co-Evolve project, extending its action towards the South & East Mediterranean Coastal Areas, and completing the framework of the MC4BG UfM labelled project. As is case with Interreg MED Co-Evolve, the analysis and the demonstration actions included in the project will produce results with a wide and long-lasting influence, fully exploiting the Blue Economy potential, promoting the creation of new markets and jobs in the field of ecosystem-oriented services (related to coastal and maritime tourism and coastal management & adaptation to climate change).

**Co-Evolve4BG** is an ongoing three-year **ENI-CBC-MED PROGRAMME** focusing on the sustainable development of maritime and coastal tourism, which was launched in September 2019 and brings together 9 partners (public regional and local administrations, universities, research institutes and a foundation).

The project will be implemented in five Mediterranean countries through 9 partners. Three European countries are represented by four partners and two Mediterranean partner countries (MPC) represented by five partners, including the lead beneficiary. With a particular focus on seven pilot areas including four in the Mediterranean partner countries (MPC), which will contribute to the transfer of the methodology and approach of the Co-Evolve project to the Mediterranean partner countries (MPC).

**MedCoast4BG** is a <u>Union for the Mediterranean (UfM)</u> labelled project since December 2017. It intends to extend **CO-EVOLVE's** conceptual and methodological model to the Southern & Eastern Mediterranean countries and involves, considering common (at the Mediterranean level) and diverse (at local level) natural, physical and geographical characteristics. The project involves the whole partnership of **CO-EVOLVE** and several other key players from the Mediterranean Partner Countries (MPC).

Both projects aim to analyse and promote the co-evolution of human activities and natural systems in touristic coastal areas, effects due to climate change and allowing sustainable development of touristic activities, in coexistence and synergy with other uses of the coastal and marine resources such as ecosystems, space etc.

Running this approach, they encourage

























the emergence of policies and initiatives to promote the development of sustainable and responsible coastal and maritime tourism management by applying the principles of ICZM and MSP witch take into account all the main challenges related to a sustainable tourism (e.g. seasonality of demand, transport, sustainable use of resources, community prosperity and life quality, preservation of natural and cultural heritage).

In the Tunisian context, ICZM approach application already has been initiated. The 7<sup>th</sup> protocol of Barcelona has introduced the ICZM to the Mediterranean on January 21<sup>st</sup> 2008. Being ratified by 6 countries, the protocol came into force on Mars 24<sup>th</sup> 2011 and was signed by Tunisia in the 21<sup>st</sup> of January 2008, however, it is not yet in force owing to ongoing ratification procedures.

Two local action plans based on ICZM are to be used for national strategies. They concern the coastal area of Kroumirie and Mogods and the south cost of Grand Sfax. Whereas, at a national scale, a strategy with defined action plans have not been yet established. In the framework CO-EVOLVE4BG project, we are looking forward to contribute to the implementation of ICZM approach by developing these action plans for a sustainable eco-tourism in the pilot areas.

Compared to Co-Evolve already running project, Blue Economy is included within the development of action plans related to the application of ICZM approach at a national scale. To stand by a sustainable growth within the marine and maritime sectors, Blue Economy represents the current strategy aiming at going faster than classical economy. The 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) state this relationship to foster sustainability by 2030, thus, ensuring economic prosperity, social development and environmental conservation in coastal areas. The main objective of the project is horning the techniques of the Blue Economy while developing the sector of tourism.

#### Co-Evolve4BG's Kick-off meeting will take place on the 18<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> of 2019, in Tunisia:

- Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> of September will consist in Technical Workshop aiming at presenting the processes that will be adopted for implementing the project. The project implementation will follow almost the methodology of the Co-Evolve project.
- Thursday 19th of September will be dedicated to an internal Steering Committee Meeting (reserved to the project's partners).

Friday 20<sup>th</sup> September will be dedicated to the official Kick-Off ceremony of the Co-Evolve4BG project.
